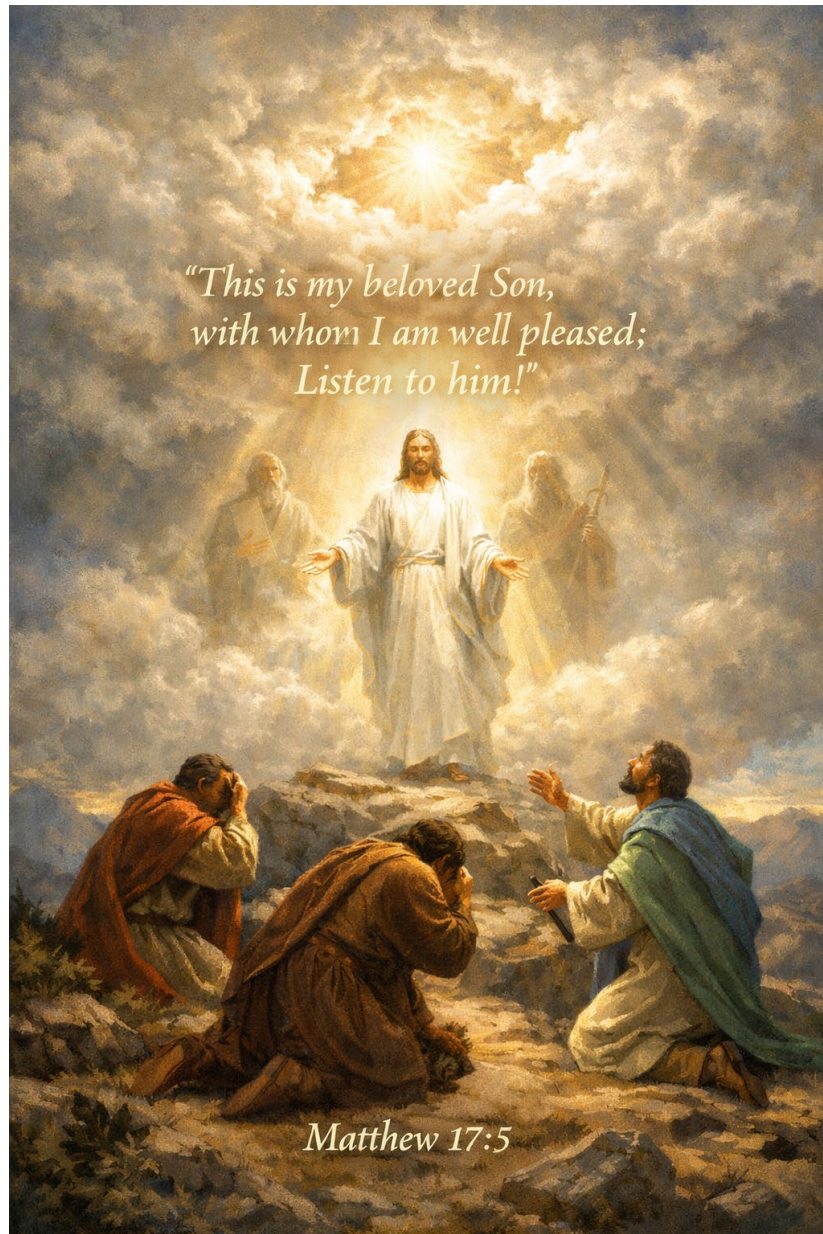

## Sentence and Greeting

Suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him!' Matthew 17.5

Baptism is the gift of our Lord Jesus Christ.

When he had risen from the dead, he commanded his followers to go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

We have come together today to obey that command.

Baptism with water signifies the cleansing from sin that Jesus' death makes possible, and the new life that God gives us through the Holy Spirit.

In baptism, the promises of God are visibly signed and sealed for us. We are joined to Christ, and made members of his body, the Church universal.

Children are baptised in response to God's all-embracing love. Parents and godparents who have responded to that love come now to bring their children for baptism. Before this congregation they must express their own trust and commitment to the promises of God, and their intention to bring up their children in the faith and practice of the Church. In due time these children should make their own response to God, and be prepared for confirmation.

So we welcome you Emilia & Leonardo with your sponsors (Godparents) and family. We give thanks for you, and pray that you may know God's love and faithfulness for ever.

## THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

### First Reading

Exodus 24.12-18

<sup>12</sup> The Lord said to Moses, 'Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction.' <sup>13</sup> So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. <sup>14</sup> To the elders he had said, 'Wait here for us, until we come to you again; for Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them.' <sup>15</sup> Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. <sup>16</sup> The glory of the Lord settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. <sup>17</sup> Now the appearance of the glory of the Lord was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the people of Israel. <sup>18</sup> Moses entered the cloud, and went up on the mountain. ## **Second Reading**

2 Peter 1.16-21

<sup>16</sup> For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. <sup>17</sup> For he received honour and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, 'This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.' <sup>18</sup> We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain. <sup>19</sup> So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. <sup>20</sup> First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one's own interpretation, <sup>21</sup> because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

## THE PRESENTATION

*The priest invites all candidates and their sponsors in view of the congregation.*

We welcome Emilia & Leonardo who have come to be baptised.

*The priest says to the sponsors of those unable to answer for themselves*

I invite their sponsors to present them now.

Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing these children for baptism?

**We will.**

Are you willing to answer on behalf of these children?

**We are.**

By your own prayers and example, by your friendship and love, will you encourage these children in the life and faith of the Christian community?

**We will, with God's help.**



## THE DECISION

*The priest says to the candidates able to answer for themselves, and to the sponsors of other candidates:*

Before God and this congregation, you must affirm that you turn to Christ and reject all that is evil:

Do you turn to Christ?

**I turn to Christ.**

Do you repent of your sins?

**I repent of my sins.**

Do you reject selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?

**I reject them all.**

Do you renounce Satan and all evil?

**I renounce all that is evil.**

Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen.**

*The priest continues:*

Will you each, by God's grace, strive to live as a disciple of Christ, loving God with all your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end?

**I will, with God's help.**

*The priest says to the congregation:*

You have heard these, our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

*The congregation answers:*

**We will.**

*The priest says* Let us pray

Grant, merciful God, that these persons may be so buried with Christ in baptism that the new nature may be raised up in them. May the fruit of your Spirit grow and flourish in them. **Amen.**

Give to these children's sponsors and family the desire to share with them what you have revealed in your holy gospel. **Amen.**

May they know Christ's forgiving love and continue in the fellowship and service of his Church. May they proclaim, by word and example, the good news of God in Christ. **Amen.**

We thank you for the ministry we have in your world and to each other in the household of faith. Hasten that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in Christ. **Amen.**



## THE BAPTISM

*The priest comes to the place where the water for baptism is, and begins the thanksgiving.*

The Lord be with you.

**And also with you.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

We give you thanks that at the beginning of creation your Holy Spirit moved upon the waters to bring forth light and life. With water you cleanse and replenish the earth; you nourish and sustain all living things.

**Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea you led your people out of slavery into freedom, and brought them through the river Jordan to new life in the land of promise.

**Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks for your Son Jesus Christ: for his baptism by John, for his anointing with the Holy Spirit.

**Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks, that through the deep waters of death Jesus delivered us from our sins and was raised to new life in triumph.

**Thanks be to God.**

We give you thanks for the grace of the Holy Spirit who forms us in the likeness of Christ and leads us to proclaim your kingdom.

**Thanks be to God.**

*The priest continues*

And now we give you thanks that you have called Emilia & Leonardo to new birth in your Church through the waters of baptism.

Pour out your Holy Spirit in blessing and sanctify this water so that they who are to be baptised in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection.

May they die to sin, rise to newness of life, and continue for ever in Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we give you praise and honour in the unity of the Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.

## THE PROFESSION OF FAITH

*The priest says to the candidates able to answer for themselves, and to the sponsors of other candidates*

I now ask you to affirm as yours the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God the Father?

**I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe in God the Son?



**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose from the dead;  
he ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father;  
from there he will come to judge  
the living and the dead.**

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting. Amen**

*The priest says to the congregation:*

This is the faith of the Church.

*The congregation responds:*

**This is our faith:  
We believe in one God:  
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.**

*The priest baptises Emilia saying:*

Emilia Jade, I baptise you in the name of the Father,  
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

*The priest baptises Leonardo saying:*

Leonardo Patrick, I baptise you in the name of the Father,  
and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

## **AFTER BAPTISM**

*When all have been baptised, the priest makes a cross on the forehead of each person, saying:*

Emilia & Leonardo, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are  
marked as Christ's own for ever.

Live as a disciple of Christ:

fight the good fight,

finish the race,

keep the faith.

*and the congregation responds, saying:*



**Confess Christ crucified,  
proclaim his resurrection,  
look for his coming in glory.**

*The priest says:*

God has brought you out of darkness  
into his marvellous light.

*The congregation responds:*

**Shine as a light in the world  
to the glory of God the Father.**

*The priest continues:*

God has called you into his Church.

*The congregation responds:*

**We therefore receive and welcome you  
as a member with us of the body of Christ,  
as a child of the one heavenly Father,  
and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.**

## **THE GREETING OF PEACE**

*All stand*

In baptism, God has made us one in Christ.

**His Spirit is with us.**

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

**And also with you.**

*The Greeting of Peace is exchanged.*
